



Public Consultation Controlled Parking Zone (CPZ) Beresford Avenue (HA0) area – Zone BA Extension

This document outlines our proposals to extend the existing zone BA CPZ in the Beresford Avenue area to your streets. Please read the information in this document, then complete, and return the enclosed questionnaire - **postage is free**. Alternatively, this document is also available for completion online at <https://haveyoursay.brent.gov.uk>. Responses from within the consultation area only will be considered. The closing date for the return of the questionnaire is **Friday 2 August 2024**.

Why are we proposing this change?

Since the introduction of the CPZ in the Beresford Avenue area the Council has received numerous complaints from residents on the periphery of the CPZ at difficulties with parking in their roads, traffic congestion and road safety generally. The area around the existing CPZ has been identified as a high priority area for parking controls and it is therefore proposed to extend the CPZ to the area shown on the plan overleaf, but only if there is majority support from the local community for the proposals.

What are the proposed improvements?

All the kerbside road space will be controlled. Yellow lines will be introduced to control road junctions (double yellow line) and vehicular accesses (single yellow). This will prevent obstructive parking on junctions and across driveways. It will also improve accessibility for pedestrians, the disabled, emergency services and refuse collection.

Parking will be either for permit holder or in 'pay by phone' bays. Residents will need to purchase permits if they, or their visitors, wish to park in the designated bays during the scheme's operational times which will be Monday to Friday, 8.30am to 6.30pm (excluding Bank Holidays) similar to the existing zone in Beresford Avenue area.

Residents will need to purchase permits if they, or their visitors, wish to park in the designated bays during the scheme's operational times. **Please note developer contributions (S106) have provided funding and we can offer a free resident's permit for lower and standard emission vehicles if the CPZ is implemented. Higher emission vehicle permits will not be supplemented.**

In summary, the CPZ is intended to give the permit holders priority use of the parking spaces during the scheme operational times but does not necessarily guarantee a parking space. However, experience with CPZ's introduced elsewhere in the borough has shown that residents are generally able to park close to their homes, even where there is a high density of residents. The proposed detailed design of the parking arrangements for the area will also be on display at the **Ealing Road Library, HA0 4BA** from 17 July till 20 July 2024. Council officers will be in attendance in the library on the following days to discuss the proposals and answer any questions you may have:

What will happen next?

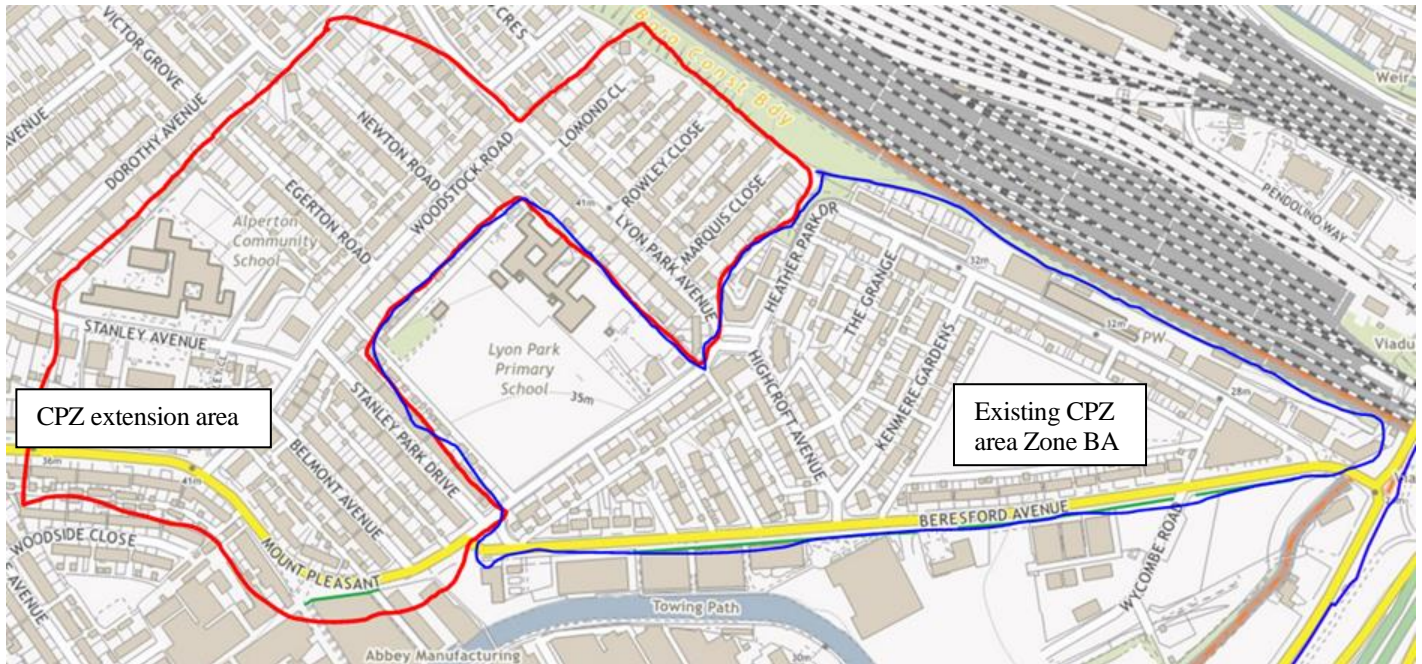
